

A Los Banos Easter tradition for more than a half-century

ince the mid-1960s, the SonRise Easter Service has been a Los Banos tradition. Hosted by St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church since the inception of the service, it is an ecumenical celebration of the resurrection of Christ Jesus.

The inaugural service was held in Pacheco Park but was moved the following year to the shores of O'Neill Forebay, across Highway 152 from San Luis Reservoir. The celebration is held annually to the left of the boat ramp, next to one of the day use picnic areas. Scattered trees and the forebay itself form a backdrop, as the sun rises over the distant Sierras, reflecting off the water through the trees.

The SonRise Service, as St. John's calls it, includes several ministers from other Los Banos-area churches. In the past, clerical participants came from First Baptist, Calvary Baptist, United Methodist, St. Alban's Anglican and Crossroads, among others.

An offering is collected as part of the service, 100 percent of which is donated to a local charity. Last year, \$300 was provided to support the Feed the Need program run by Los Banos Rotary

The entire community is invited to attend the service, regardless of your church home or lack thereof. St. John's provides some folding chairs, but many arrive with their own chairs, not to mention blankets. Early spring mornings can be chilly and a challenge for the musicians to stay in tune!

The San Luis SRA management has been generous in recent years to The Los Banos Sonrise Serivice in 1967, one of the first such services held at the O'Neil Forebay.

The entire community is invited to attend the service, regardless of your church home or lack thereof.

accommodate this event, including providing free parking passes good for the duration of the service only.

While the service went on hiatus in 2020 due to the pandemic, the State Park made contact in 2021 to find out if St. John's would resume the tradition. The service resumed its place in Los Banos lore.

Plans are to continue this year, pending permission from the State Park. The gates open to the Forebay at 6 a.m., with the service starting at 6:30. Keep an eye for announcements in the Westside Express concerning scheduling and pass availability.

A wonderful life, now changing, on Los Banos dairy farms

t the 1978 Future Farmers of America Convention, Paul Harvey delivered a speech that has stood the test of time. It was even included in a Super Bowl commercial a while back.

In the beginning of the speech, Harvey said, "And on the eighth day, God looked down on his planned paradise and said, 'I need a caretaker.' So God made a farmer.

"God said," the commercial continued, "I need somebody willing to get up before dawn, milk cows, work all day in the fields, milk cows again, eat supper and then go to town and stay past midnight at a meeting of the school board. So, God made a farmer."

This is a wonderful speech, and it touches my heart, but I could have used one more paragraph at the end to address how a farmer deals with change.

I have lived in Los Banos my entire life--63 years to be exact. It is probably quite rare today to still live in the same town you were born in, rarer yet to have never left or lived anyplace else. That allows me to gauge and experience much change.

Change comes at a price. You appreciate that you have been blessed to live in the same place for your "forever," but along with that is the reality of change, and some of that is difficult.

Agriculture has always been a part of my life and certainly a big part of the development of Los Banos. My grandfather had a small dairy and farmed, as well as my grandfathers-In-law.

The next generation, my father-in-law, farmed and milked cows. My father loved cows, but more those on the beef side, and he was also a pioneer in the beekeeping industry in our area.

My husband and I were also in the dairy industry for 42 years until May of last year, when we decided to retire, and watched our cows loaded up in semi-trucks and hauled to Arizona Dairy to begin their new life, as we remained behind to figure out life beyond cows.



Not only have I experienced change, so has my hometown. Progress in agriculture in our community has caused changes in many lives.

Dairy and farming is something all the ancestors I remember did. It was a wonderful life when I was growing up, a wonderful way for my husband and me to raise our children and teach them a strong work ethic. It has been a difficult life to leave behind.

Not only have I experienced change, so has my hometown. Progress in agriculture in our community has caused changes in many lives. In our community of Los Banos, the small dairies were replaced by bigger dairies, the small farms were replaced by larger farms, and much of the farmland became the housing tracts that have changed the rural landscape.

I now find myself caught up in change, but just as my ancestors before me, I understand that this was

he Los Banos Arts Council is the heart and focal point for the cultural activities in the Los Banos community. The mission is to support, encourage and promote the arts, cultural and educational activities in Los Banos and to benefit charitable and non-profit activities, including service club activities, in the community.

A major goal of the council is to bring arts and culture to the Los Banos community at affordable prices. The group is very community minded and dedicated. Throughout the years, the arts council has

worked tirelessly on supporting and organizing music concerts, art and photography shows, exhibitions, theater, youth programs and activities.

In 1994 a group of visionary Los Banos residents came to the rescue of the building, which had previously been the home of St. Joseph's Catholic Church. It was also renamed to the Ted Falasco Arts Center to honor the group's primary benefactor, local philanthropist and successful business owner Ted Falasco, following his passing.

There are three other buildings connected to the arts center. The annex is located at 1125 Fifth St., with

the Mel Soares Arts Studios next door at 1143 Fifth Street. The fourth location is the Robert Huddleston Crafts Studio located at 510 I St.

The Arts Council schedules a concert series annually.

Evie Ladin Band will be in concert April 21 with a unique style of music and dance. More detailed information is available online. Ticket prices are kept low--\$20 for general admission and \$15 for students.

The Community Theater of Los Banos is another significant program offered for the residents. It is free to join for ages 10 and older. The theater normally holds two productions per year and always welcomes new actors and actresses to join.

The Quilt Guild is another Arts Council group that is focused on build-

ing a community around quilting and inspiring each other in supportive ways. The Guild meets from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. every Wednesday at the Mel Soares Arts Studios. Beginning quilters can get help on their projects and can connect with expert quilters. Guests are always welcome.

Other classes are taught each year at the arts center include ceramics, painting, pottery, card making and much more.

The Arts Council hosts an Open Mic Night that provides local singers, musicians, poets, dramatists and comedians a place to perform, perfect their craft and show off their talents. It is a great way to spend an evening enjoying all of the untapped talent in the Westside community.



Service at the heart of city government

he City of Los Banos' government includes a wide array of departments all with the goal of serving the community.

City Council meetings are held on the first and third Wednesdays of the month in City Hall, 520 J Street, where the public may address members of the council. City Council members include Mayor Paul Llanez and Councilmembers Kenneth Lambert (District 1), Douglas Begonia Jr. (District 2), Brett Jones (District 3) and Deborah Lewis (District 4).

City Hall is not only the home of council meetings. It houses several departments for day-to-day operations of Los Banos, including administration, finance, community and economic development and building. From 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., City Hall is open to the public to pay their utility bill, sign up for utility services, obtain a business license, and/or apply for various permits and develop city entitlements.

The City of Los Banos is also home to other groups, such as the Planning

Senior Brown Bag Program

Senior Brown Bag Program takes place on the 2nd and 4th Thursday of every month from 9:00am to 11:00am in Los Banos and Dos Palos at the following locations

> Los Banos -New Beginnings Church - 821 West L Street Dos Palos - Carver Center -21475 Revnolds Ave Dos Palos- Living Well Cafe - 931 Center Street

If you are 55 or older with an income at or near \$1,707.50 you may qualify for the program. You can register on the day and time of the distribution at one of the locations listed. You would need to bring Proof of Income, Proof of Address, and ID.

Currently, in Merced County there are over 21,000 seniors whose income is at or below 130% of the federal poverty guidelines - which equals \$1,286 a month or less.

This year, our low-income seniors (who's average social security check is less than \$1,000) are being particularly hardhit by the rise in gas costs, rent increases, sales tax increase and the added costs of food and healthcare.

For many of us, these small increases are an inconvenience and we adjust our budgets, and/or work more hours to make up the difference.

However, for those of our neighbors who live on fixedincomes and can't work, there is only one choice - sacrifice something to make up the difference.

Often, that sacrifice is nutritious food.

The Senior Brown Bag program is here to fill that gap for thousands of our elders and is entirely supported through individual and business contributions.

Merced County Food Bank's Brown Bag Program provides supplemental nutritious groceries twice a month to over 3,500 older adults at 16 distribution sites in Merced County. Seniors receive groceries from distribution sites set up throughout our service area, usually churches, senior centers,

or community resource centers.

There is no cost to the individuals served and eligibility is determined by using the federal income guidelines for poverty.

Senior Brown Bag Program participants are also provided with opportunities to volunteer at their food pickup site, which offers • Other staple items them social connections and a sense of belonging and purpose. Every month, more than 200 volunteers gather at Senior Brown Bag sites to sort, bag, and distribute food to their peers. Many participants have built new friendships and renewed their sense of community by volunteering.

After a lifetime of hard work, 63% of the households with older adults (50+) that Merced County Food Bank serves find themselves being forced to make difficult but unavoidable choices such as whether to purchase their medications, pay for their housing, and/or pay their utilities. Buying food, especially nutritious food, is often last on their list.

And as the baby-boom generation ages, the number of seniors facing hunger is only expected to increase. MCFB is working hard to prevent this.

It takes just \$60 annually to help feed a senior for a year through the Senior Brown Bag Program.



Higher Education Dreams Fulfilled for Los Banos Students

he Merced College Los Banos Campus, a satellite site of the Merced Community College District, opened its doors in 1971 to give Westside Merced County residents easier access to education and job training

Fast-forward more than 50 years later and the Los Banos Campus has continued to grow, now serving nearly 2,500 students each semester with academic offerings ranging from general education requirements to career technical education programs, such as the popular Welding and Medical Assisting programs.

In addition, the campus has robust noncredit offerings to serve adult students in achieving their GED, learning English, becoming a U.S. citizen, and acquiring basic computing skills. Virtual instruction at the campus was expanded in Fall 2022, with courses taught by Merced Campus faculty being streamed live to Los Banos.

Students at the Los Banos Campus receive "wraparound" student services that include personal and academic counseling, a food pantry, tutoring services, book vouchers, and programs for special populations. The campus also endeavors to cultivate a full college experience for Westside students, with active student-run clubs like Social Sciences and MEChA. Both clubs participate in community events, such as the local Trunk-o-Treat and Kindergarten Book Giving.

Child Development Center

April Heft, a new faculty member charged with leading the development of the Child Development Center at the Los Banos Campus, brings a wealth of experience and expertise to the role.

Heft helped open the first nonprofit center, Children Today, to serve homeless children and families in the Long Beach community. Then in the Newport-Mesa Unified School District, she was instrumental in establishing the first inclusion preschool program in the district, serving children with special

Now, Heft is fulfilling a much-needed gap at the Los Banos Campus, becoming the first full-time child development faculty member there in nine years. Her presence will enable the college to offer Westside students access to all the core child development coursework without having to travel to the Merced Campus for certain courses.

Heft also has a leading role in the development of a new child development center at the campus. Set to open in Fall 2023, the Los Banos Child Development Center will serve two important purposes: first, serving as a laboratory site where students can be coached and mentored as they develop and refine their teaching practices; and second, as a high-quality early childhood care and education school, which will serve children from three months to five years old.

What's New and What's Next

The future is bright for the Los Banos Campus, which is looking to add more new instructional programs like Agriculture and Computer Technology Information Systems. A campus beautification project will bring new exterior and interior paint, a new student café, and a renovated food forest.

Also new to the Los Banos Campus is a Welcome Center in which Student Services staff can assist students from start to finish on their journeys. Services available in Los Banos include EOPS, CARE, CalWORKS, DSPS, and the Food



WHATEVER IT TAKES:



Wildlife refuges near Los Banos provide unique outdoor attractions

ne of the wonderful things about living in Los Banos are the nearby special outdoor attractions, some unique to the state and all free to enjoy.

The San Luis National Wildlife Refuge Complex headquarters is a short drive north on California State Highway 165 to Wolfsen Road and then two miles east to the refuge entrance. The complex is comprised of three refuges - San Luis, Merced, and San Joaquin River - which in total Include about 47,000 acres of varied wildlife habitat. All three refuges are open yearround from one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset.

Visitor services personnel staff the visitors center from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday except on federal holidays when the building is closed. They can answer questions about the refuge complex and the flora and fauna that might be seen there. Maps of the refuges' auto tour routes and walking trails are available inside the center and can also be viewed on the refuge website (http://www.fws.gov/refuge/ san-luis/).

At the San Luis refuge is a large herd of tule elk, a species almost hunted to extinction in the late 1800s. The herd at the refuge lives within a large enclosure and an auto route, about 5 miles, runs along the perimeter. Elk can be seen from the auto route or the

observation platform on the west side of the enclosure most of the time.

A longer auto route provides visitors a chance to see some of the many species of birds and other wildlife that inhabit the refuge either seasonally or year-round. During the winter, tundra swans can often be seen in the wetlands and sandhill cranes in the uplands, all visible from the auto route. The route also leads to parking at trail heads for walking trails.

The Sousa Marsh trail is slightly longer than one mile and leads to a newly refurbished wildlife observation platform which provides visitors an elevated place to view the upper Sousa Marsh and, during the winter months, a chance to look at thousands of ducks, geese and other migratory waterfowl which frequent the wetland.

Visitors to the Merced National Wildlife Refuge in the spring can often see wide swaths of flowers from their car along Sandy Mush Road before coming to the entrance to the refuge. Inside the refuge there are areas of pasture where native clovers and other wildflowers grow. But far outnumbering flowers at Merced refuge are the migratory waterfowl and other birds that live there from fall to late

Two of the most enjoyed attractions to the refuge in winter are the largest population of lesser sandhill cranes along the Pacific Flyway and more than 60,000 snow and

Ross' geese. More than 10,000 cranes roost there in the wetlands at night. Watching and hearing them fly in from feeding grounds in all directions just before sunset is an unforgettable experience.

During the winter season visitors can also easily see thousands of ducks, and other waterbirds like ibis, egrets, herons, and migratory shorebirds from the auto route as well as a number of raptor and songbird species. Occasionally bald eagles can be seen hunting over the wetlands.

Closer to Los Banos, vernal pools, so named because they are generally filled with water in springtime, are sources of magnificent displays of wildflowers as the weather warms and the pools begin to dry. The Kesterson unit of the San Luis refuge has many natural pools and other areas that, while not technically vernal pools, provide spectacular displays of goldfields and downingia, flowers typical to native pools.

There is no vehicle access to Kesterson (except to hunters during waterfowl season

and refuge personnel) but it's a flat, relatively smooth and rewarding walk to the pools. The unit is described as "free roam" meaning, once inside, visitors can walk wherever they desire. Access to the refuge parking lot is off California state highway 140 between Stevinson and Gustine.

Anyone not bothered by a couple-mile walk and the absence of any facilities will find treasure at the state of California's Great Valley Grasslands State Park. None of the nearly 3,000-acre park has ever been farmed so many native plants can be found there, although fighting a losing battle with invasive species of exotic cool-season grasses and forbes.

While the flowers that live in them are common to California the type of vernal pools at the state park exist nowhere else. Visitor access is by foot or bicycle only, off California state highway 165 just south of the San Joaquin River. Follow the road to the first tee intersection then go south on that road and keep an eye out for flowers.

How the older adult population is getting more accessible healthcare in Los Banos



Valley Spring Memory Care held a Los Banos Chamber of Commerce ribbon cutting in January of 2023 soon after opening in December of 2022.

he older adult population is growing at a steady pace. By 2050, adults more than 65 years of age will contribute to approximately 30 percent of the population in the United States.

Los Banos is no exception with its diverse and culturally rich population. What was once an agricultural town is now booming with new businesses and growing healthcare.

When I initially started working in Los Banos in 2021, physicians were rarely going to nursing homes to treat the aging adults. Since then, three physicians from the local medical group Apex have started seeing patients in the nursing homes that are in town, including New Bethany Nursing Home, Los Banos Nursing Home and the newly opened Valley Springs Memory Care Nursing Home specific for dementia patients.

From a geriatrician standpoint, there

is no greater sense of fulfillment to see physicians from other fields like Outpatient Internal Medicine and Family Medicine taking up the helm in helping the older adults in the rural population. These are areas where healthcare access is limited.

We have veterans, farmers, agricultural land workers, factory workers, welders, electricians and people from all walks of life aging gently and being taken care of by physicians.

The current census is a total of 7,300 geriatric physicians in the US with 1.07 per 10,000 older adults. Even in comparison to a bigger metropolitan city,

the increasing availability of geriatric care in Los Banos is higher and the reason for this is most of the geriatricians in larger cities are part of an educational institution and outpatient access is limited at best.

Most of the time, the older adults are not aware of the availability of resources to them, thinking that it is part of getting old and refrain from reaching out. I urge all of us who have aging older adults in our houses to teach and inform them that help is just round the corner, and all they have to do is just reach out.

This is just the beginning of growing healthcare needs and opportunities and as our town expands and develops. I am sure there will be more physicians coming in and making healthcare even more accessible.





Pickleball players anticipate expansion of facilities in Los Banos

n activity that has gained popularity in Los Banos within the past few years is the sport Pickleball.

Pickleball, known as the "fastest growing sport in America," is a mixture of badminton, tennis, and ping pong as players use a paddle to hit a wiffle ball over a short net. Only two people are needed to play the game, but there can be up to four players on one court.

The pickleball community in Los Banos is expanding. There are well over 100 active players in Los Banos with new faces showing up at the courts each week. The most popular locations in the city to play pickleball are on weekdays at 9 am. to 1 p.m. in the Community Center, located at 645 7th St., and at Los Banos Fitness & Racquet Club, located 1520 Racquet Club Dr.

The two USA Pickleball Ambassadors in Los Banos are Laurie Balatti and Dayna Valadeo, both of which promote pickleball in the city and offer lessons in pickleball, which involves teaching important safety tips, hitting techniques and scoring rules.

Pickleball has seen a surge in popularity primarily among retirees in Los Banos, but the pickleball community is played among all age groups, with ages ranging from pre-adolescence to people in their 80s. Balatti emphasized that since pickleball is a sport for all

ages, it presents a unique opportunity for connection between younger and older generations.

The size of four pickleball courts is equivalent to one tennis court. Since four people can play on one pickleball court, that means a total of 16 people can fit in the space of a tennis court.

A game of pickleball can be played at close range, allowing for more interaction between players, which, on the courts in Los Banos, includes helpful feedback, laughter and encouragement.

Many players said they love the sport because it gives them an opportunity to exercise in a way that is fun and exciting, but they put a special emphasis on their ability to socialize and connect with others through pickleball.

"The conversation that you get to have during play is a big aspect to me," said Kat Young, a pickleball player and mother of two. "It's nice to get to know your community members in a playful environment. You see the best of people."

"I've only been here for four years," Young added. "Now I feel like, all of a sudden, I have friends."


Cresthills Park, located at 700 Pioneer Rd. was initially being evaluated for the location of six new courts, replacing an existing volleyball court. However, several members of the city council instead considered putting 12 courts in the downtown area, possibly west of the Henry Miller Plaza on the Rail Trail.

Although the location and scope of the project has not yet been determined, dedicated players see a bright future for pickleball in Los Banos.

Balatti hopes to get the youth more involved in pickleball by creating youth leagues and making pickleball an intramural sport in schools.

With so many people taking interest in pickleball, the sport will continue to grow and connect an even larger community of positive, healthy, happy individuals in Los Banos and afar.

Commission, Airport Advisory Commission, Tree Commission, Traffic Safety Committee, Parks and Recreation Commission and Committees for Measure H and Measure P.

Los Banos has two operating fire stations, one on 7th Street and one on West I Street. Both are led by Fire Chief Paul Tualla, who has over 30 years of experience in various first responder roles.

The Los Banos Police Department is currently on 5th Street, but there are plans in the works for the building of a new station. The department is headed by Chief Gary Brizzee.

The new and improved police station will reside at 1111 G Street, near the new Merced County Courthouse. With its completion scheduled for October, the new station will house all of the departments under one roof, which the city hasn't seen since staff were moved


